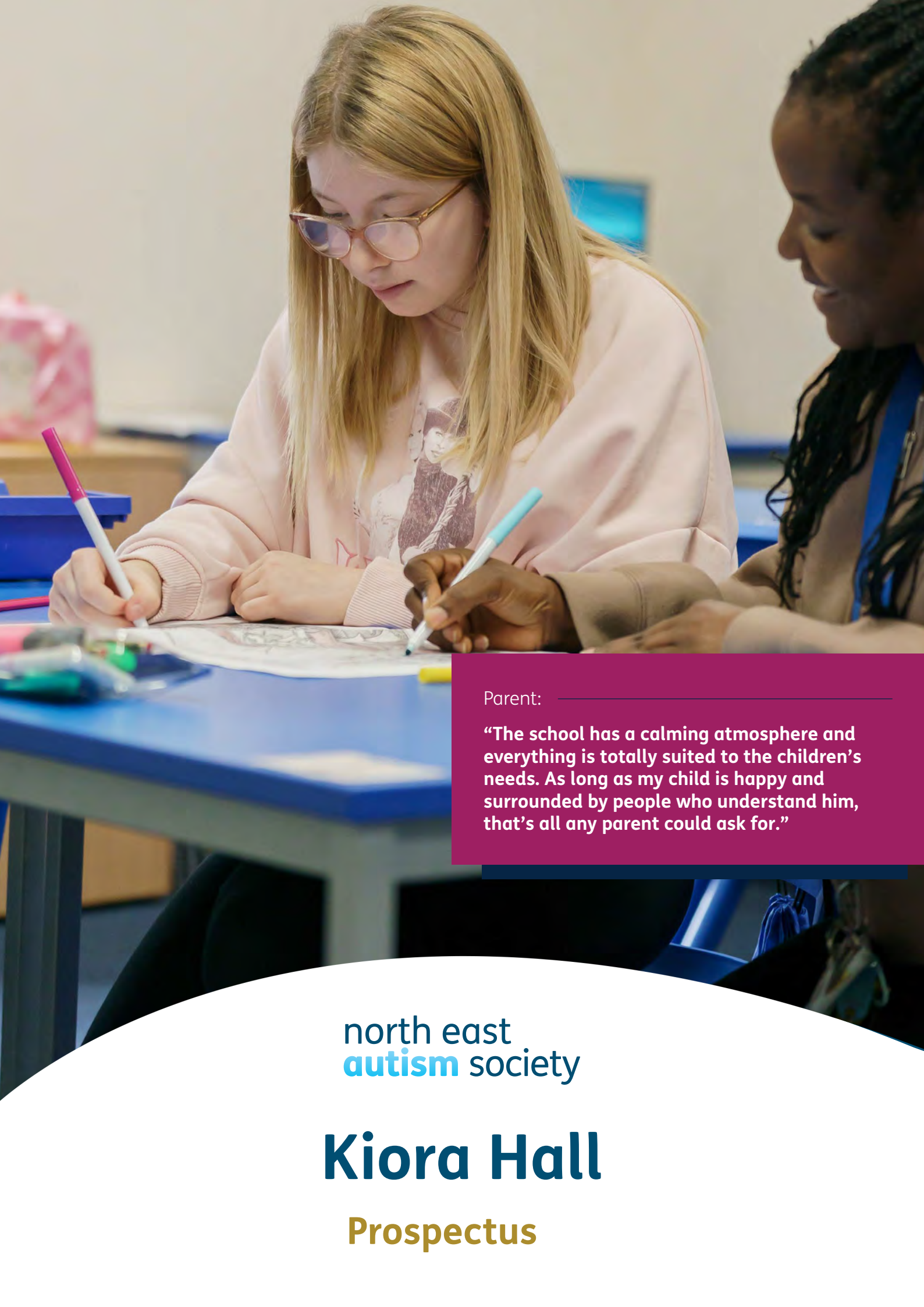

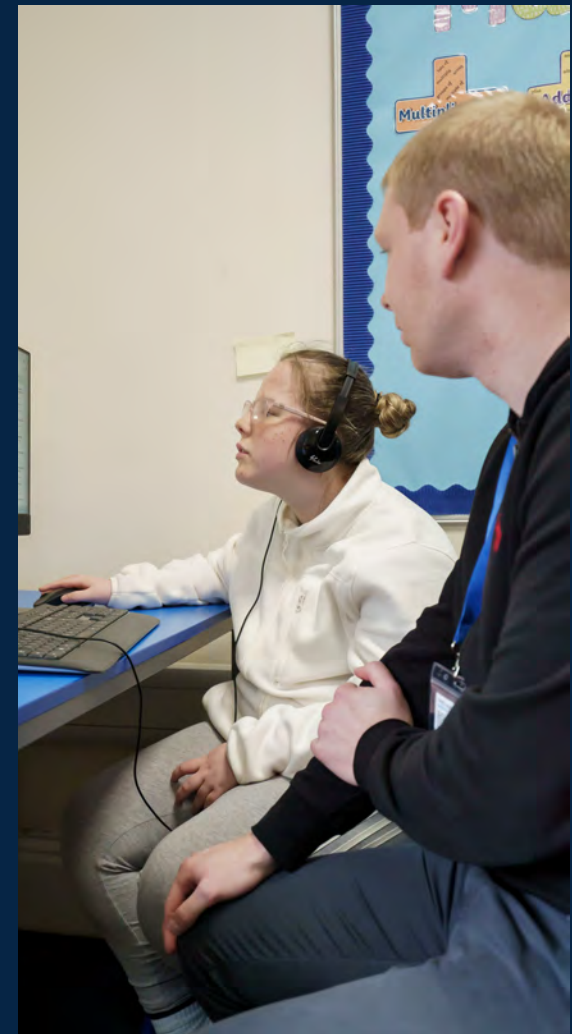
Our Vision

The Curriculum

At Kiora Hall, we are committed to helping our pupils fulfil their potential by preparing them for the next stage in their education, employment and lives.

Our ambitious curriculum is divided into four learning pathways with each pupil matched to the route that is best suited to their assessed needs and individual aspirations.

Our curriculum is designed to:

- Develop skills and knowledge in line with pupils' planned destinations
- Promote communication and community engagement
- Empower pupils to have greater independence
- Increase self-confidence and resilience
- Equip pupils to be responsible, respectful and active citizens
- Develop skills to enhance employment opportunities
- Develop transferrable functional skills
- Support pupils to develop strategies to regulate their own well-being

We use a range of specialist strategies to support our pupils:

- Total communication approach
- Individualised Support Plans
- Bespoke learning environments
- Hierarchy of Cues
- Zones of Regulation
- Visual support systems
- Sensory profiles
- Staff with specialist training
- A range of differentiated teaching and learning strategies
- Multi-disciplinary approach
- Staff are extensively trained in Positive Proactive Support
